

Hearing Voices Research & Development Fund Regional Trainings - Request for Proposals

The Fund is beginning a 3-year training and research project to bring Hearing Voices peer-support groups to communities across the United States, and to research the mechanisms by which these groups work. The project will train more than 100 facilitators in 5 regions and create a stronger regional and local infrastructure of Hearing Voices peer-support groups across the USA. Once a greater number of groups are up and running, the project will conduct a comprehensive study whose goal will be to identify the factors promoting effectiveness of these groups.

Proposals are now welcomed from individuals and organizations who would like to be selected as one of the 5 project regions across the USA where the trainings will take place. (Participation in the research phase of the project will be fully voluntary, regardless of whether or not someone has participated in any of these trainings.)

Goals of the Training Project

The project is aimed at creating opportunities for individuals and organizations who want to establish Hearing Voices groups and local networks in their own communities and regions, especially in areas where such resources are sparse or non-existent. Successful applicants will collaborate with our technical support team to train up to 25 people to create and maintain co-facilitated Hearing Voices peer-support groups, to develop a local network to support the ongoing work and growth of these groups, and to facilitate community dialogue around voice hearing. The training has a 3-day format. The trainers will also participate in a free community forum held during their time in that region, so that a broader public can learn about the HVN approach. While proposals from all parts of the USA will be considered, it is acknowledged that HVN has a firm representation in the Northeast. Therefore priority will be placed on regions where hearing voices peer-support groups are less prevalent.

Proposals will be evaluated in terms of the applicant's ability to mobilize support and create a structure or network using assets specific to their community or region and which will encourage the ongoing development of the Hearing Voices approach in that area. Your own creativity and knowledge of your region should be reflected in the application.

Frequently Asked Questions:

- 1. Does our group have to be affiliated with a mental health provider?
 - No. We welcome applications from peer and community organizations or from individuals who want to work together within a region.
- 2. What priorities will govern the evaluation of applications?

Applications that provide evidence of already-existing collaborations between groups of individuals or between mental health organizations and peer-run community groups will be prioritized. Proposing an innovative approach to public outreach and building the network in that region will also increase the likelihood of an application being selected.

3. Do all of the Hearing Voices peer-support groups that are created as a result of this training have to commit to participating in the research component of the project?

No. After the training phase is completed, the research protocol will be designed in collaboration with regional networks and Hearing Voices groups around the country, and then all groups in the USA – those created as a result of these trainings and those already existing – will be asked whether they would like to participate in the research process. All participation will be entirely voluntary.

4. Is ongoing support offered after the training?

Yes. The project team will collaborate with groups and individuals within the 5 regions to set up networks of support to ensure that groups can thrive over the long run.

5. Will participants be charged a fee for the training?

No. The Hearing Voices Research and Development Fund is committed to involving as many individuals and groups as possible in Hearing Voices trainings and all the events sponsored by this project will be offered free of charge.

- 7. If you are in a provider role, how would you partner with people who hear voices in the development of your group/network? If you are someone who hears voices yourself or are part of a peer-to-peer group, how would you continue to expand your reach to new voice hearers in your area?

- 2. Do you have access to a training facility that is (preferably) not associated with traditional mental health offerings? Does it have audio/visual capabilities and internet access? What costs would be involved in holding the training there? Please describe.
- 3. Is the location you are considering close to public transportation? Fully accessible? Near a national airport?
- 4. What sort of outreach methods would you plan to use to attract training participants? Do they include specific outreach to voice hearers? Community-based peer-to-peer efforts? Please describe.
- 5. What time(s) of the year would you hope to offer this training and why? Are there specific constraints in your region that would make training problematic at certain times of the year?
- 6. If you have access to other financial resources, how would you plan to use them to complement this training opportunity?
- 7. What geographic area would your network cover? Is it considered "rural," "urban," etc. or some combination of these?
- 8. How would you involve the broader community to support the training and to make the HVN approach better known in your region?
- 9. What skills, strengths, experience, and/or other resources would you plan to draw upon that haven't been covered in other questions?
